Michigan's schools face an increasing wave of cyber threats that disrupt education and compromise sensitive data. In 2023. MiSecure initiative launched to provide schools with the tools and support they need to defend against cyberattacks.

WHY MISECURE MATTERS

MiSecure keeps Michigan's schools open and operational, preventing disruptions caused by cyberattacks. By safeguarding sensitive data and ensuring continuity of public education, the program builds trust within communities. It empowers schools with the expertise and tools needed to navigate an increasingly complex cyber landscape.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Looking ahead, MiSecure aims to expand protections to staff and student devices while developing statewide cybersecurity training programs. Plans also include creating shared firewall management systems to enhance collaboration and efficiency. Continued funding will ensure that Michigan's schools remain secure against evolving digital threats

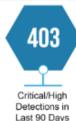
